### Description

Natural spring well in water logged area at foot of ash tree.

### Appraisal

Although venerated in living memory the stone-lined natural spring well is no longer visited. There are not sufficient structural remains of architectural interest present to warrant its retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for Lady Well exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU005-003.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Lady Well, Stephenstown, Co. Dublin is deleted from the Record of Protected Structures

**Description**

**Appraisal**

Within a field known as 'chapel meadow', this is the site of a chapel which may have served a nearby medieval settlement. There are no visible surface remains to warrant its retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the chapel site exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU005-001.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Chapel Site, Folkstown Lane, Folkstown Little, Co. Dublin is deleted from the Record of Protected Structures

**Description**

Site of holy well that was formerly located in a hollow on a hillside but is now within the open space of a housing estate and has been piped and capped with concrete.

**Appraisal**

The original well site has been completely altered by the landscaping of the open space that raised the surrounding ground level significantly with a manhole cover now marking the location of the well. There are not sufficient structural remains present to warrant its retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the well exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU005-057007.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Holy Well and Potential Site, Old Coach Road, Rosepark (Balrothery), Co. Dublin is deleted from the Record of Protected Structures

**Description**

The enclosure site is not visible as a housing development has been built on the lands and the site is now within the property boundary of No. 26 The Channies, Balbriggan.

**Appraisal**

An oval crop mark of a levelled enclosure on a South-west facing slope was identified on an old aerial photograph, however “The Channies” housing development now occupies the site and there are no visible remains at ground level. As there are no structural remains present it does not warrant retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the ringfort exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU015-006001.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Ringfort Possible Site, Kilsough, Co. Dublin is deleted from the Record of Protected Structures
