
## **Description**

#### <u>Appraisal</u>

A cist was exposed during construction of a house in 1897. Site has been redeveloped recently and now modern apartments on site. There are no structural remains present to warrant retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the burial mound site exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU015-028001.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Burial Mound Site, Harbour Road, Howth, Co. Dublin is <u>deleted</u> from the Record of Protected Structures.


## **Description**

The castle was demolished prior to 1937. There are no structural remains present above ground to warrant retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the Drumleck castle site exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU019-007.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Drumleck Castle, Ceanchor Road, Censure (Howth), Co. Dublin is <u>deleted</u> from the Record of Protected Structures.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Cemetery, Sutton RFC, Station Road, Burrow Howth, Co. Dublin is <u>deleted</u> from the Record of Protected Structures.

Alternative protection for the site of burial ground, exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU015-023.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Site of Burial Mound, Dublin Road, Sutton, Co. Dublin is <u>deleted</u> from the Record of Protected Structures.
