

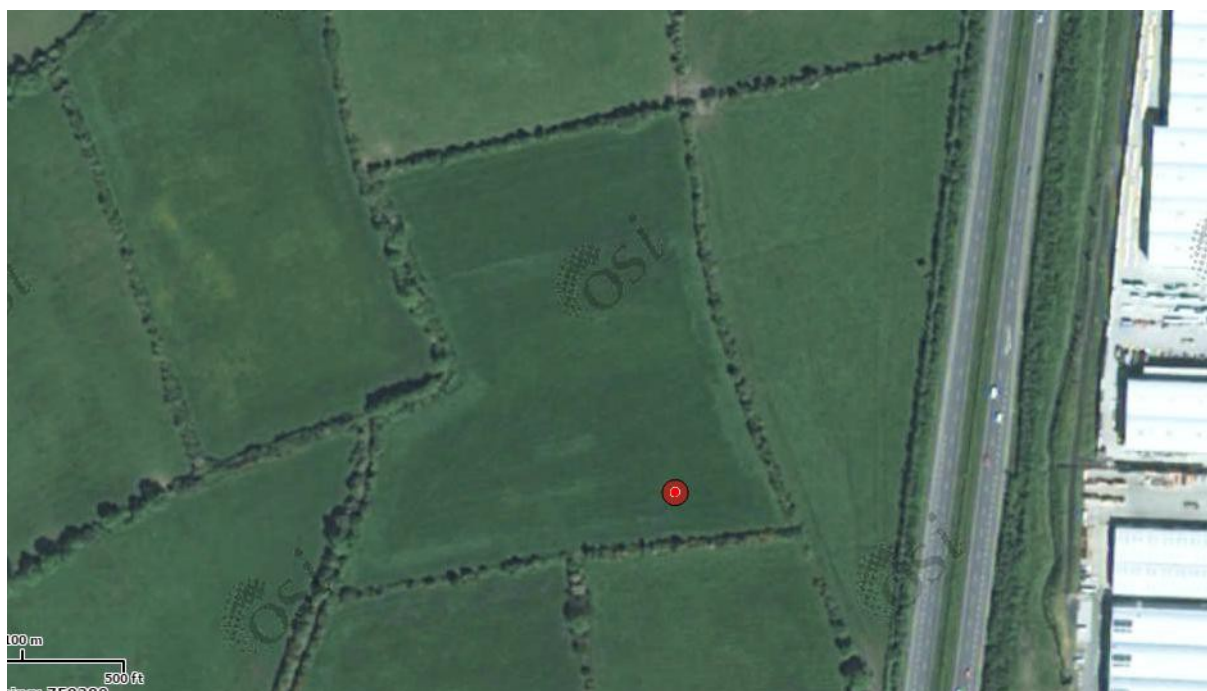

### **Description**

Circular enclosure with diameter of circa 20m located on east facing slope.

### **Appraisal**

The enclosure was identified from a crop mark on 1972 aerial photograph. There are no structural remains present above ground to warrant retention in the Record of Protected Structures. Alternative protection for the Ringfort site exists under the National Monuments Acts 1930-2004, as a Record Monument RMP Ref No. DU004-017.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Ringfort possible site, off Rowans Road, Rowans Big, Co. Dublin is deleted from the Record of Protected Structures.
